## Why do Catholics do that??

### How Long is the Easter Season?

The Catholic Church celebrates Easter for **50 days** — from Easter Sunday all the way to Pentecost Sunday. Why? Because resurrection deserves more than a one-day party. Because joy needs room to grow. Because sometimes, the truth of Easter takes time to really sink in. Easter is a **SEASON** meant to change how we live, pray, and see the world.

#### What Happens During the 50 Days of Eastertide?

**Days 1-8 - Octave of Easter** the first eight days of Easter are celebrated like one long, joy-filled "Easter Sunday."

**Day 8 - Divine Mercy Sunday** Jesus told St. Faustina that this Sunday would be a *flood of grace*. We're reminded: *There is no sin too big for His mercy.*

**Day 40 - Ascension** Jesus returns to the Father — and promises to send the Holy Spirit.

**Day 50 - Pentecost Sunday** - The Holy Spirit came down, and the Church was born.

The apostles go from hiding in fear to boldly preaching. It's the fire we all need to live out the Gospel.
