Why do Catholics do that??

When Should Catholics NOT Receive Communion?

The Church teaches that there are two basic requirements Catholics must meet in order to receive Holy Communion worthily. First, one must be in a state of grace meaning free from mortal sin and second is to abstain from food or drink for one hour before receiving the Eucharist.

The Catechism (CCC 1415) states, "Anyone aware of having sinned mortally must not receive communion without having received absolution in the sacrament of penance."

For a sin to be mortal, or deadly, one must be aware that the act is sinful and conscientiously commit it anyway.

Examples of mortal sins include: Murder, adultery, sexual acts outside of marriage, theft, abortion, euthanasia, pornography, and taking advantage of the poor. The Church teaches that intentionally skipping Mass on a Sunday or holy day of obligation when one could attend is also a mortal sin.

The US Bishops elaborates on this point by saying, "To receive the Body and Blood of Christ while in a state of mortal sin represents a contradiction. The person who, by his or her own action, has broken communion with Christ and his Church but receives the Blessed Sacrament, acts incoherently, both claiming and rejecting communion at the same time. It is thus a counter sign, a lie - it expresses a communion that in fact has been broken.
