Why do Catholics do that??

What is the Eucharist?

The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist is the true Body and Blood of Christ. Together with His Soul and Divinity under the appearance of bread and wine. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term Eucharist originates from the Greek word eucharistia, meaning thanksgiving.

In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and in the instrumentality of the priest. The whole risen Christ is truly present - body, blood, soul, and divinity - under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life.

The Eucharist is not a mere symbol. The transformed bread and wine are truly the Body and Blood of Christ and are not merely symbols. When Christ said, "This is my body," and "This is my blood," the bread and wine are transubstantiated. Though the bread and wine appear the same to our human faculties, they are actually the real body and blood of Jesus.

May we always remember that Jesus is REALLY present in our church and show him the reverence and respect due our Lord.
